

EasyRoyalties and the Apple MAC

EasyRoyalties can be used with any new Intel-based Mac*. And by running Microsoft Windows on your Mac as a “guest” operating system, you can even use EasyRoyalties and That’s Rights! (Optional rights marketing module) directly from your Mac desktop, without having to reboot.

To start using EasyRoyalties on an Intel-based Mac you will need:

- A copy of any Microsoft Windows operating system, from Windows 2000 and later (e.g. Windows XP or Windows Vista). Windows can be purchased from any computer supplier.
- Software to run Windows as a “guest” system on your Mac. There are several options available; one we can suggest is “Parallels Desktop for Mac” (<http://www.parallels.com/>).

Setting up EasyRoyalties:

1. Install Parallels.
2. Then follow the instructions for installing Windows.

(NOTE: EasyRoyalties can run in under any version of Windows from Windows 2000 and up; however please check with Parallels regarding any restrictions on which version of Windows you may use as a “guest” operating system. For example, Windows Vista *Home* is not available for use as a “guest” system, whereas you can use Windows Vista *Business*)

3. Once Windows is installed and running on your Mac, just go into Windows and install EasyRoyalties. You can then use Parallels to add a EasyRoyalties icon directly on your Mac desktop and/or to your Apple menu.

*To tell if your Mac computer is Intel-based:

- Click on the Apple in the top left corner.
- Select "About This Mac" from the list.
- Look next to "Processor". This will tell you if your computer has an Intel or PowerPC processor.
